Arrohattoc District Training

- All courses are national BSA training courses presented by district volunteer instructors.
- You may take training in any district.
- There are four main components to Training (the first three can be done online at <http://www.olc.scouting.org>):

Fast Start Training

Fast Start training is the first step for any new volunteer and is to be delivered immediately after a new leader registers and before he or she meets with any youth member.

This is Scouting (replaces new Leader Essentials)

The new Basic Leader Training comprises two parts: New Leader Essentials for all unit-level leaders and Leader Specific training, which is based on the leader's unit-level position.

Youth Protection

Every leader in Cub Scouting should complete Youth Protection training, which provides essential information about working with youth.

Leader-Specific Training

These break out sessions are for specific positions within a Cub Scout Pack , Boy Scout Troop, and Venturing Crew and some have an introduction to outdoor skills.

The Boy Scouts of America Centennial Silver Dollar

The weaving of thoughts, cultures, and ideas into one American fabric is stamped into our national identity - *E Pluribus Unum*, "Out of Many, One."

In 2010, the United States Mint will inscribe that phrase onto a new commemorative coin that honors the centennial of the Boy Scouts of America. Beginning March 23, the United States Mint will make available for sale 350,000 high quality, modern issue, commemorative silver dollar coins.



Like the inscription on the coin, the BSA gathers together youth from all backgrounds. So, it is fitting that the surcharges from the sale of each coin are authorized for use to benefit the BSA National Foundation in its efforts to bring Scouting to underserved communities. Surcharges for the coin sales may generate up to \$3.5 million for this very worthy cause. For the first thirty days the proof coin will be offered at

\$39.95 and the uncirculated coin will be offered at \$33.95, after which the prices will be \$43.95 and \$35.95, respectively.

Judge William S. Sessions, former Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and Distinguished Eagle Scout, is the Honorary Chairman of the BSA's initiative to promote the Boy Scouts of America Centennial Silver Dollar. Judge Sessions' son Congressman Pete Sessions of Dallas, Texas, also a Distinguished Eagle Scout, introduced and championed the

legislation that authorized the BSA to be one of the two commemorative coins produced by the United States Mint in 2010.

We expect this limited quantity of coins to sell fast! While orders cannot be placed in advance, beginning at noon (ET) on March 23, 2010 orders can be placed through the United States Mint at www.usmint.gov or at 1-800-USA-MINT.



2010 Historical Merit Badge Program

Merit badges have been a fixture of the Boy Scouts of America since its inception in 1910. The requirements that generations of boys have completed have taught lifetime citizenship lessons, personal fitness habits, and life skills. They have been the beginnings of countless careers and lifetime hobbies. In the last 99 years there have been many changes in the merit badge offerings. As society has changed, the Boy Scouts of America has adapted by revising the requirements, implementing name changes, and in some instances, eliminating some badges altogether.

For the 100th Anniversary celebration four vintage merit badges are being released for the Centennial Year only, giving Boy Scouts the hands-on opportunity to experience the exciting past of BSA.

Here are the basics of the 2010 Historical Merit Badge program:

- An overall goal of the program is for a majority of our registered members to earn one or more of the badges during the Centennial year.
